These works, developed with the guidance of Co-Program Directors Karen Duplisea, Vicki St. Denys and full time staff member Nadia Potts offer an eclectic show of creativity and innovation.

Choreographic Works introduces many talented aspiring dancers and choreographers to the Toronto dance community. Performances offer a diverse range of movement styles including contemporary, modern, ballet, and jazz. *Choreographic Works* is one of the most popular shows at Ryerson Theatre School, with sell-out crowds every year.

Vicki St. Denys (Producer) is one of Canada's leaders in the field of jazz dance, instruction and choreography, and is often invited to guest teach, choreograph and give master classes throughout Canada and in the United States. She is equally at home in the academic world of dance lecturing at conferences, adjudicating performances and advising arts institutions. In addition to being a full-time faculty member at Ryerson University, she also choreographs for television, film, video, theatre and opera. From 2000-2007 she was the jazz pedagogue and choreographer for the dance program at the Banff Centre and in 2008 began teaching and choreographing for the Opera as Theatre program. Vicki holds Master of Arts degree in dance from York University, and is sought after throughout North America for both teaching and choreographing.
